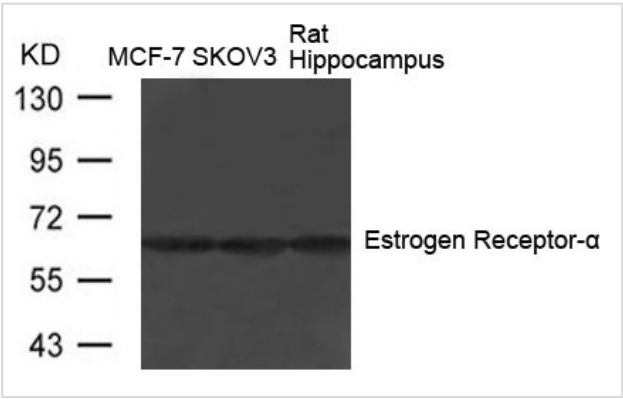

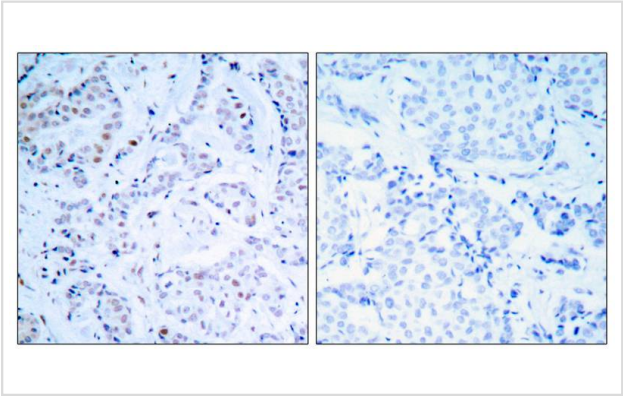

Immunohistochemical analysis of paraffin-embedded human breast carcinoma tissue using Estrogen Receptor-a(Ab-104) Antibody #21065(left) or the same antibody preincubated with blocking peptide(right).

Descriptions

Immunogen	Peptide sequence around aa.102~106 (S-V-S-P-S) derived from Human Estrogen Receptor- α .
Specificity	The antibody detects endogenous level of total Estrogen Receptor- α protein.
Purification	Antibodies were produced by immunizing rabbits with synthetic peptide and KLH conjugates. Antibodies were purified by affinity-chromatography using epitope-specific peptide.
Formulation	Supplied at 1.0mg/mL in phosphate buffered saline (without Mg^{2+} and Ca^{2+}), pH 7.4, 150mM NaCl, 0.02% sodium azide and 50% glycerol.
Storage	Store at $-20^{\circ}C$ for long term preservation (recommended). Store at $4^{\circ}C$ for short term use.
